March Demo - Marc Josloff

We are happy to have Marc Josloff return for our March 5th meeting. Some of you might remember Marc's demo in November 2009. It was a great demo and merited a return engagement. Marc is an insightful painter and photographer. He earned his BA degree in Advertising and has studied painting at a multitude of regional colleges with several mentors. including Mel Stabin. Irwin Greenberg and Paul Ching Bor.

Since 1978, Mr. Josloff's artwork has been exhibited in galleries throughout the New York metropolitan area. His paintings have also

been included in private and public collections. Recently the Art Student League of New York purchased his painting, "Boy on a Scooter at the Hotel Deville".

A gallery exhibition of select works from the ASI permanent collection entitled "The League Then and Now" displayed Marc's painting alongside those of Georgia O'Keefe, Will Bamet, Norman Rockwell, William Merritt Chase and other notables. Marc was featured in "Watercolor Magic" magazine, December 2004, in "11 Hot Artists - Ones to Watch."

When Marc was with us in 2009 there was a noted increase in attendance at the meeting. The caliber of demonstrators can well be attributed to this increase. Mark explained his

technique to the participants in a casual way.

We are indeed fortunate to have Mr. Josloff at our next demo. It is our intent to bring our membership, artists that can enrich, motivate and inspire. As so often quoted "we never stop learning". This is an excellent opportunity to glean from one of the great artists of this time in history.

The response from our December meeting was an overwhelming WOW! We were indeed enriched by the wonderful demo that was presented by Rob Silverman. There was silence and amazement as he masterfully proceeded with his portrait of Cliff Forziat. Cliff, of course, was an excellent subject and was patient and enduring. The result as you can see by the picture in the bottom right corner was a perfect match.

Rob explained the importance of light in portrait painting as well as the proportions of the human head, which in most instances were pretty much the same with some exceptions. He used a grid frequently to get those proportions as exact as possible.


Rob preferred to work in a water based oil and used a paper towel to frequently clean his brush as well as to merge colors and change tones.



His easygoing way of instruction was enjoyable and he was more than willing to answer questions and share his expertise with the participants.

There was a raffle of one of Rob's portraits. An overjoyed Barbara Leonardi was the winner of that raffle.

Needless to say, it was an enjoyable evening, well attended, and many of the members stayed later to converse with the artist and partake of the holiday refreshment made available by our hostesses.

During the past year, Canada's Leader of the Opposition, Jack Layton, died of cancer at the age of 61. In his final message Jack said, "My friends, love is better than anger. It's been my observation that these main brands of working love can be bound together into a wholesome bundle where tangible, finished work is key to hope, optimism and a sense of well-being. "Work," said Kahlil Gibran, "is love made visible."



The finding of love within our work unlocks the studio and prompts the actions of hand and mind. The extraordinary prevails and even ordinary and well-trodden subject matter can be freshly explored and rejuvenated. One might even be blessed with the aura of popular greatness. "He alone is great," said Gibran, "who turns the voice of the wind into a song made sweeter by his own loving."

In my last letter of the old year I mentioned the gentle productive hum of studios. Between the turning on and the turning off of the lights there's a span of privilege. Held steady by the gentle hand of love, we begin, we keep going, and we sign off. There may not be a higher calling.

PS: "In the arts, as in life, everything is possible provided it is based on love." (Marc Chagall)

Esoterica: One of the great features of studio life is the capacity for renewal. Daily love manifests itself and is a fairly reliable prod. Some projects can be measured in no time at all. Sometimes three or four projects can be performed and completed in a single day. Other projects progress over days or weeks, dependent on the uncanny sleep-work that lies between.
